NAMI Mississippi provides educational programs and support services to individuals with mental illness and their loved ones. We annually host a walk event, NAMIWalk, to raise the funds needed to offer our programs and services, as well as introduce new ones. The event not only raises funds for NAMI Mississippi and its affiliates, but it also raises awareness about mental illness.

Mental illness affects everyone. Nearly 60 million Americans experience a mental health condition every year. Regardless of race, age, religion or economic status, mental illness impacts the lives of at least one in four adults and one in 10 children across the United States. In our service areas of Meridian, Vicksburg, Hattiesburg, Gulf Coast, Tupelo, Oxford, McComb, Yazoo City and metro Jackson there are over 20,000 people whose lives are touched by mental illness. - NAMIWALKS is a nationwide fundraising and mental health awareness program
 that is being held in more than 80 communities around the country in 2016,
 including right here in Jackson, MS. It is expected that these walks will raise
 approximately \$15 million dollars in 2016 for NAMI and the mental health
 services it provides to thousands of families across the country.
- There is no walker registration fee for the Walk. All participants are encouraged to collect donations from family members, friends, co-workers and business associates in support of their participation in the Walk.
- All the funds collected by Walkers will be used to fund NAMI's programs here in Mississippi. These programs include support, education, research and advocacy involving schizophrenia, bipolar disorder (manic depression), major depression, obsessive-compulsive disorder and severe anxiety disorders.
- All walkers raising \$100 or more with receive a coveted **NAMIWALKS** event T-shirt.
- Companies, organizations and families are encouraged to organize teams of walkers made up of employees, organization members, relatives and friends to take part in the Walk.
- Teambuilding and fundraising materials will be given out to team captains at a special kickoff event that will be held approximately 8 weeks before the Walk.
- NAMIWALKS MISSISSIPPI is a rain or shine event.
- There is a wide-range of corporate sponsorship opportunities available to local companies and businesses relating to the Walk. SEVEN POINTS:

WHY NAMIWALKS IS AN EVENT YOUR COMPANY SHOULD SUPPORT

- The Issue & Stigma. This Walk is for an issue Mental Illness that many think is the
 "last thing to come out of the closet." The Fear of Stigma is so great and the Walks are
 giving people the opportunity to come together and make public discourse about mental
 illness and admission of mental illness okay.
- 2. <u>Inclusivity</u>. The Walk is "inclusive." We invite other mental health constituencies to join us at the Walk with materials about their programs. (Note: We are not sharing revenue. This is a NAMI fundraiser.)
- 3. <u>Validation and Good Will</u>. The Walk and its participants are part of a movement much bigger than themselves. People will be walking in NAMIWalks in cities across the country. People are hungry for this validation. Business sponsors of the Walk will be in a very visible and positive position with great goodwill to be gained from the community.
- 4. <u>Benefit to Employers</u>. NAMI programs are grassroots, volunteer driven programs that provide education and support to family members and individuals living with mental illness. These programs are not provided anywhere else in the mental health system and help employees without any cost to employers. Twenty to twenty-five percent of employees are touched by mental illness in some meaningful way and can benefit from NAMI programs without charge.
- 5. <u>Evaluation.</u> NAMI affiliates evaluate the efficacy of their programs and strive to maximize measurable results. NAMI Mississippi will use our Walk funding to train additional teachers so we can expand our Family-to-Family, Basics and Peer-to-Peer programs in response to heavy public demand.
- 6. <u>Gratitude.</u> We receive emails and phone calls every single day from people who say "Thank you so much for doing this!" and then they proceed to tell their stories often for the first time.
- 7. <u>Competence and Commitment</u>. We have a very committed and capable Walk Steering Committee. They will make sure the entire Walk effort is exemplary.
