We appreciate the support you gave us last year for the first Old Man River QuiltFest. We will be holding the second Old Man River QuiltFest on August 22-26, 2017, and need your support.

Please allow this letter to serve as an event confirmation for the following:

Event: Old Man River Quilt Festival

Days and Usage: The festival moves in on Sunday, August 20.

Event days are Monday, August 21- Saturday, August 26 (they move out the afternoon of the 26<sup>th</sup>). They are utilizing the entire facility for those 7 days. There will be meal functions the entire week.

Room Nights: There are 150 booked each night of the festival in the following hotels that are holding room blocks: The Hampton Inn, Holiday Inn, and Courtyard by Marriott. (Plus other rooms that will be booked outside the blocks)

Attendance: They have confirmations from vendors and attendees from Louisiana, Alabama, Arkansas, Texas, Tennessee, California, Florida, North Carolina, Kansas, and Oklahoma The event consists of 20 vendors, 5 workshops and there will be many entries for the judging of the best created quilts. The event organizers are expecting an estimated 3,000 total visitors for the Thursday – Saturday Tradeshows.

Estimated Direct Spending: \$225,000 (using a conservative daily attendance of 500/per day) Estimated Economic Impact: \$382,500
