Dear Patrons and Friends:

A little history on the poppy, during the First World War (1914–1918) much of the fighting took place in Western Europe. Previously beautiful countryside was blasted, bombed and fought over, again and again. The landscape swiftly turned to fields of mud: bleak and barren scenes where little or nothing could grow.

Bright red Flanders poppies, were delicate but resilient flowers and grew in their thousands, flourishing even in the middle of chaos and destruction. In early May 1915, shortly after losing a friend in Ypres, a Canadian doctor, Lt Col John McCrae was inspired by the sight of poppies to write a now famous poem called 'In Flanders Fields'.

McCrae's poem inspired an American to make and sell red silk popples which were brought to England by a French woman. The British Legion, formed in 1921, ordered 9 million of these popples and sold them on 11 November that year. This was used to help WWI veterans with employment and housing.


