

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN DAVID DAY, OWNER AND
OPERATOR OF THE KLONDYKE TRADING POST,
AND THE CITY OF VICKSBURG, MISSISSIPPI


WHEREAS, David Day owns and operates a business known as Klondyke Trading Post which is a restaurant and lounge located at 100 North Washington Street in the City of Vicksburg and he has agreed to improve the security and operation of his business in order to prevent any violent or illegal activities for the safety of the patrons of the business, the community and its citizens; and

WHEREAS, The City of Vicksburg has a responsibility to the citizens of the community to provide for its safety and well being and to take preventive measures against the recurrence of violent actions at local businesses.


WHEREAS, The Klondyke, which has been closed for its lounge business since a shooting occurred on its premises, will be allowed to reopen its lounge business on 2/23/18 subject to the following stipulations and agreements:

1. There will be a zero tolerance policy for any disturbance, argument, or other conflict between guests anywhere on the premises. At the first sign of any such activity, law enforcement will be called.
2. Staff will be trained on what actions to take at the first sign of a disturbance.
3. Security will be hired for the lounge hours starting at 9:00 PM on nights when the number of patrons is expected to reach or exceed 50% of capacity. This will remain in place for at least thirty days, and until David Day and the Chief of Police agree that this is no longer needed.
4. Staff will request that the police walk through from time to time.

So agreed this the 23 day of February, 2018.
